# Making Space for Nature in Kent & Medway Priorities for Nature mapping tool privacy notice

## May 2024

We keep this privacy notice under regular review and it was last updated on 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024.

Kent County Council (KCC) respects your privacy and is committed to protecting your personal data. This privacy notice will inform you as to how we look after your personal data and tell you about your privacy rights and how the law protects you.

#### Who are we?

KCC collects, uses and is responsible for certain personal information about you. When we do so we are regulated under the United Kingdom General Data Protection Regulation ('UK GDPR') and the Data Protection Act 2018. We are responsible as 'controller' of that personal information. KCC's Natural Environment and Coast Team (acting as Responsible Authority for the Kent & Medway Local Nature Recovery Strategy) commissioned Kent Wildlife Trust to create the online Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway *priorities for nature* mapping tool.

The mapping tool will be accessible via the Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway website, which is managed by KCC's Natural Environment and Coast Team. The tool will allow any interested parties to map where they would like to see the LNRS priorities, and associated potential measures, delivered. The purpose of the spatial priorities mapping tool is to allow the widest input of people to what is anticipated to be the area of interest to most – where action is proposed to take place. It is primarily a people engagement tool, an online workshop if you like, where people can highlight where in the county nature recovery should be prioritised.

## The personal information we collect and use

Information collected by us

In the course of being an account holder for the online Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway *priorities for nature* mapping tool, we collect the following personal information when you provide it to us:

- Contact name
- Contact email
- Your interest in nature recovery
- Whether you own the land (or lease or manage it) in the area you have proposed

All these personal information items are optional and you do not have to enter any of these details to submit a priority for nature.

### How we use your personal information

We use your personal information to:

- Contact you for more information on your nature recovery priority, if required.
- Map your proposed priority area, along with others, to create what is essentially a long list of potential priority areas to be considered during the mapping stage of the LNRS process.
- To understand who we're hearing from in Kent and where interest in the Local Nature Recovery Strategy might lie within our community.
- To understand your relationship with the area of land proposed.
- Contact you to seek any interest you may have in being involved in the Making Space for Nature project and LNRS delivery.
- Contact you regarding any issues or queries you may have regarding the online Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway *priorities for nature* mapping tool.

## Reasons we can collect and use your personal information

We rely on Article 6(1)(a) of GDPR 'data subject has given consent to the processing of their personal data for one or more specific purposes' as being the lawful basis on which we collect and use your personal information.

The provision of personal data is required from you to enable us to undertake the tasks listed above in relation to the online Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway *priorities for nature* mapping tool.

# How long your personal data will be kept

Personal information will be retained where provided to keep you informed on the progress of the LNRS.

Non-personal information regarding proposed priority areas will be kept indefinitely for the purposes of informing the LNRS and future projects.

## Who we share your personal information with

- Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway (a KCC project) are hosting the link to the online Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway *priorities for nature* mapping tool on their website. Read the Making Space for Nature privacy notice.
- Kent Wildlife Trust (a third party provider) has created the online Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway *priorities for nature* mapping tool and provide back-end technical support to the online tool. The tool will not collect any personal information via its cookies. Read the <u>Kent Wildlife Trust privacy notice</u>.
- Making Space for Nature project team.
- Your proposed area and priority/action detail will be displayed on the viewable map but no personal information will be viewable via the online platform.

We will share personal information with law enforcement or other authorities if required by applicable law or in connection with legal proceedings.

We will share personal information with our legal and professional advisers in the event of a dispute, complaint or claim. We rely on Article 9(2)(f) where the processing of special category data is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims or whenever courts are acting in their judicial capacity.

The data is stored within the South-East UK. Login information is stored by Auth0<sup>1</sup>, an authentication provider, who have data centres in Dublin, Ireland and Frankfurt, Germany. This is based on an adequacy decision by the Secretary of State and safeguards prescribed by the UK GDPR.

#### **Your rights**

Under the UK GDPR you have several rights which you can access free of charge which allow you to:

- Know what we are doing with your information and why we are doing it.
- Ask to see what information we hold about you (subject access request).
- Ask us to correct any mistakes in the information we hold about you.
- Object to direct marketing.
- Make a complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office.

Depending on our reason for using your information you may also be entitled to:

- Ask us to delete information we hold about you.
- Have your information transferred electronically to yourself or to another organisation.
- Object to decisions being made that significantly affect you.
- Object to how we are using your information.
- Stop us using your information in certain ways.

We will always seek to comply with your request however we may be required to hold or use your information to comply with legal duties. Please note: your request may delay or prevent us delivering a service to you.

For further information about your rights, including the circumstances in which they apply, see the guidance from the UK Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) on individuals' rights under the United Kingdom General Data Protection Regulation.

## Your right to withdraw your consent

## **Keeping your personal information secure**

We have appropriate security measures in place to prevent personal information from being accidentally lost or used or accessed in an unauthorised way. We limit access to your personal information to those who have a genuine business need to know it. Those processing your information will do so only in an authorised manner and are subject to a duty of confidentiality.

We also have procedures in place to deal with any suspected data security breach. We will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected data security breach where we are legally required to do so.
